HOSPITAL PROGRAMS

The Leavey Trauma Center and the J. Thomas McCarthy Center for Emergency Services

The hospital's Level II Trauma Center opened in 2004 and is one of only 13 in Los Angeles County. Our trauma team is ready round the clock to provide life-saving care to local residents, visitors and commuters. The Foundation is completing a \$9 million capital campaign to renovate and expand the Trauma and Emergency Services Center.



Los Angeles Center for Women's Health



Scheduled to open in fall 2011, this new center will be the first of its kind in downtown Los Angeles to serve a full range of women's health and wellness needs, focusing on breast, cardiac, gynecologic and hormone health. The center, which will occupy the top floor of the new Loker Medical Arts Pavilion on the southeast corner of the hospital's campus, is being specially designed as a tranquil, healing environment that provides convenient access to leading-edge, patient-centered care.

Women's and Children's Services

California Hospital welcomes hundreds of babies each month. Our perinatal services for women include inpatient and outpatient support by a skilled medical team, breast-feeding education and support, infant care and parent education classes. Family-centered care is the emphasis in our pediatrics unit, nursery and neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). One of the busiest in the city, our fully-equipped NICU enables staff to save the lives of many babies who would otherwise have little chance of survival.



Orthopedics

Launched in 2003, the orthopedics program delivers a full range of orthopedic services. The highly skilled medical staff members ensure that patients receive optimal care for arthritis, back pain, knee and hip replacement, hand surgery, and physical and speech therapy.

Donald P. Loker Cancer Center

The cancer center has been a pioneer in radiation therapy since 1922, offering a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach to cancer care. The center offers education and prevention services, radiation and chemotherapy, cancer screenings and diagnosis, and support services and counseling.



Hope Street Family Center

The Hope Street Family Center is a nationally recognized child and family development program that provides a wide range of health and human services to low-income families, helping families successfully meet the challenges of urban living. The Foundation is currently conducting a \$15.7 million capital campaign to construct a new, free-standing center across from the hospital.

SUPPORTING CALIFORNIA HOSPITAL

California Hospital Medical Center established its foundation in 1985 to raise philanthropic support for building projects, equipment, and patient care services. The generosity and vision of our donors generate the resources we need to provide highest quality medical care to all in need, regardless of their ability to pay.

The Foundation has a staff of 10 and is governed by a Board of Directors that oversees a comprehensive fund development program incorporating special events, private foundation and corporate grants, individual giving, and government support. Since its inception, the Foundation has raised more than \$145 million. Donors may support the hospital with an outright or planned gift, and can choose to designate their donation for a specific program or project, or towards the overall charitable mission of the hospital. All gifts are tax-deductible to the extent allowed by law.
