

## Grand Tower grand opening marks new generation of care

On January 7, 2025 we celebrated the opening of our Grand Tower, a momentous event made possible by the incredible generosity of our community. The week that followed quickly showcased the profound impact this expansion had on the health and well-being of Angelenos. Within days after opening, CMHC welcomed the very first baby born in our new modernized maternity unit- a joyous symbol of new beginnings for a family supported by your philanthropic investments. Simultaneously our J. Thomas McCarthy Emergency Center and Leavey Trauma Center were bustling since day one—powerful reminders of the critical need and immediate benefit this expansion brought, and will continue to bring, to our community.

This \$215 million capital project was a significant investment in the health of Greater Los Angeles designed to be an essential anchor point for generations to come. Your \$25 million in philanthropic support was instrumental in bringing this vision to life. As the only full-service emergency and Level II trauma center in downtown LA treating 80,000 patients annually, the Grand Tower ensures we continue providing exceptional life-saving care to all who come through our doors. This is your compassion in action.

"This thoughtfully designed facility significantly expands CHMC's emergency, trauma, and maternal care services, providing families with advanced care close to home, addresses critical healthcare gaps, and reinforces our mission to improve health equity for the 85,000 residents and 500,000 workers of downtown Los Angeles."

The new Emergency Department is a testament to this commitment, more than doubling in size and integrating leading-edge technology. It boasts more specialized care areas including dedicated pediatric rooms and a streamlined patient experience designed to improve care delivery

and reduce wait times, and six trauma bays (compared to our previous two trauma bays) for our most critically injured patients.

For expectant mothers and newborns, the Grand Tower offers a truly transformative experience. A private entrance leads to a fully redesigned Family Birth Center complete with private triage, antepartum and birthing rooms. The maternity care enhancements include 28 private postpartum rooms ensuring greater comfort and privacy for new mothers alongside 24 private rooms in our Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) replacing the previous ward-style setup. This allows families to bond with their newest arrivals in a peaceful, private setting. Additionally three state-of-the-art surgical suites and a children's play area in the waiting room highlight CHMC's dedication to creating a familyfriendly, advanced care environment.

The Grand Tower reinforces our commitment to providing advanced equitable care that serves all Angelenos. The Grand Tower stands as a beacon of hope and healing underscoring CHMC's unwavering commitment to addressing the needs of underserved communities and promoting greater health equity across the region. Thank you for your kindness in action for being a vital part of this inspiring achievement and for creating a healthier Los Angeles.

"It's important for everyone to have good health care and access to our services. You never know when you'll need care. I'm not a doctor, but if I can contribute in some way I will. This is how I give back. This is our hospital."

## Igniting potential: the Oxford Family After-School Program Fund at Hope Street

For nearly 30 years, Sid Oxford has been a cornerstone of Hope Street Margolis Family Center's After-School Program, mentoring countless children since 1996. In 2025, he established the Oxford Family After-School Program Fund with a \$50,000 gift—a testament to generations of dedication to vulnerable youth.

Sid's commitment stems from values instilled by his parents, Isabel "Betty" Morales Oxford and Richard O. Oxford. Growing up in Los Angeles with their unconditional support, he experienced firsthand the impact of positive adult role models. "My parents were either at a practice or a game or they were coaching me," he recalls. This inspired his work with children whose families faced barriers to regular involvement. "I truly appreciate working with these kids because they or their parents don't have the opportunities that my parents had," he explains. "I make sure that these kids know that they're supported, they're loved...that there are people out there that truly want to see them succeed."

The Oxford family's connection to Hope Street runs deep. Betty, a former schoolteacher, was one of the program's first volunteers, dedicating countless hours tutoring children. Richard, co-founder of Dial Industries, Inc., joined the CHMC Foundation Board of Directors and Hope Street's Fund Development Advisory Board. Both championed Hope Street throughout their lives. At the 2016 Annual Giving Society President's Reception, they received the "Spirit of Philanthropy Award." Betty passed away in 2017.

At Hope Street, "relationships are the secret sauce," Sid notes. The program offers academic support, recreational activities, field trips and the annual Summer of Science program. This year was especially meaningful when two former students returned as UC Riverside graduates and Hope Street employees, serving as mentors themselves.

After almost 30 years, Sid shows no signs of slowing down. "These kids keep me young and as long as what I'm doing is meaningful, then I don't know if I could stop."

"I couldn't be prouder of the work Sid has done," Richard adds. "By establishing this fund, he's ensuring its vital impact will continue for generations."

### Dr. Sophia Pak's enduring support for CHMC

Dr. Sophia Pak, a pathologist at CHMC, embodies a strong commitment to health and healing. Her critical diagnostic work, though "behind the scenes," directly impacts patient treatment. A long-time donor, Dr. Pak cemented her dedication to CHMC's future by establishing a charitable gift annuity in 2019, a planned gift that will provide her with guaranteed fixed payments annually for her lifetime, while also supporting the hospital's mission.

Dr. Pak's passion for giving originated from her mother's example of kindness in South Korea. She was drawn to CHMC for its "familylike" environment and its service to the "underserved, uninsured and vulnerable," finding her work fulfilling by bringing hope to the community. Her support for our Grand Tower tile campaign is reflected in the Rafael and Sharyl Mendez Family Foundation Garden, where her tile inscription states: "These have been the best [30] years of my life working with dedicated doctors and all the hospital staff will treasure the experience endlessly." Dr. Pak hopes her philanthropy creates a "ripple effect," inspiring others to join in solving critical health challenges together. Her enduring legacy at CHMC is a guiding light of compassion and hope.

## Lifesaving rhythms: Philanthropy's impact on telemetry at CHMC

At CHMC, the dedication of our staff is matched by your generosity, which fuels their life-saving work. The recent acquisition of a new telemetry monitoring system exemplifies philanthropy's impact.

Jenny Choi, Director of Nursing for Telemetry, oversees a department providing continuous cardiac monitoring for patients. A critical \$1.5 million upgrade allows staff to continuously read cardiac rhythms with enhanced sensitivity, with data transmitted to a central monitoring room. This precision allows for earlier detection of issues, preventing complications and improving outcomes.

For Choi, philanthropy is essential. "With the patient population we serve, we don't always have a lot of resources," she noted. Donor support provides tools and "reassurance that if anything is needed, we have someone we can open our hands to." Choi's personal commitment stems from seeing her uninsured father's struggles. She finds purpose in serving CHMC's vulnerable patients and working alongside her dedicated "family" of colleagues.
